How is the State of the World?

The 2023 year is unfolding rapidly.

The economic pessimism at the close of last year has given way to more balanced hopes that the world economy will recover, that inflation will be beaten back, and that growth will resume. We will hear directly about the inflation outlook and prospects for the Australian and global economy from **Dr Philip Lowe, Governor of the Reserve Bank of Australia**.

Interconnected with the economic prospects, of course, are the impacts of tensions that continue to rise between nation states. War rages in Ukraine. Geo-political blocs are solidifying. Who is my friend? 'Globalisation' as we knew it previously is in at least partial retreat.

Yet, at the same time, the impacts of underlying global forces, such as climate change and AI, are increasingly present and real, demanding collective global action.

India will host the G20 this year, under the banner: '*One Earth. One Family. One Future.*' India's focus will be striving for '*just and equitable growth for all in the world*', navigating through these turbulent times, in a sustainable, holistic, responsible, and inclusive manner. **India's G20 sherpa, Dr Amitabh Kant**, will address us on India's priorities for the G20.

Looking through and beyond the immediate future, it appears clear that we are living through an era in flux, overflowing with doubt and uncertainty. This moment of seismic transition cries out for leadership and new forms of global collaboration in securing the common good.

UN Secretary General, Mr Antonio Guterres said recently that we must '*overcome our preference for the present*', that this is a time for global transformation, saying '*we must end the merciless, relentless, senseless war on*

nature' and that we need a '*radical transformation of the global financial architecture*'.

Paris Peace Forum President, Mr Pascal Lamy, has reminded us that '*the previous international order, insufficient as it may have been, is broken and history tells us that such moments in the past have all too often preceded major conflicts, suffering and horrors*'.

Taking a lead in re-making globalisation

Is it possible to re-invent globalisation, to make it more equitable and fit for purpose? Is it possible to re-imagine a form of globalisation that binds humanity more closely together, for a world that is based upon fair, just and sustainable principles?

Many global leaders have urged the Global Foundation to play an active role in bringing the world back together around a renewed form of *co-operative globalisation*.

Cardinal Pietro Parolin, second in command to Pope Francis, wrote to urge our Global Advisory Council to pursue a **globalisation of solidarity**.

Recently, French President, Emmanuel Macron called for a new spirit of **universalism** to succeed **multilateralism**, that is, for a world that rises above the language and limitations dictated only by nation states.

And as one who sits at the centre of the global economic system, World Trade Organisation Director General, Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala, has urged us to promote **re-globalisation**.

Professor Dr Dewi Fortuna Anwar MA

Research Professor, Research Centre for Politics-National Research and Innovation Agency, Indonesia

Dewi Fortuna Anwar straddles the world of academia, political activism and government. She is a Research Professor at the Research Centre for Politics-National Research and Innovation Agency (PRP-BRIN), formerly known as the Research Centre for Politics-Indonesian Institute of Sciences (P2P-LIPI). She has written widely on Indonesia's foreign policy, Indonesia's democratization as well as on ASEAN and regional political and security issues. She is an Academician of the Social Science Commission-Indonesian Academy of Sciences (KIS-AIPI), Chairman of the Board of Directors of The Habibie Center (THC), and co-founder of the Foreign Policy Community of Indonesia (FPCI). She served as the Deputy Chairman for Social Sciences and Humanities- Indonesian Institute of Sciences (IPSK-LIPI) from 2001 to 2010. From October 2010 to February 2017 Dewi first served as Deputy Secretary for Political Affairs and then Deputy for Government Policy Support to the Vice President of the Republic of Indonesia.

Dewi was the Kippenberger Visiting Chair at Victoria University, Wellington in Oct.-Nov. 2018, a Distinguished Visiting Professor at the RSIS, Nanyang Technological University Singapore in Aug. 2017- Aug. 2018, a Visiting Fellow at CSEAS, Kyoto University in early 2010, and a Visiting Professor at SAIS, Johns Hopkins University in 2007.

Dewi sits and has sat in a number of national and international advisory boards. She is currently a member of the Foundation Board of the Centre for Humanitarian Dialogue (HD) based in Geneva, a member of the Board of Trustees of the Nanyang Technological University (NTU) in Singapore, an Advisory Board member of the UWA Public Policy Institute, University of Western Australia and a board member of the Centre for Policy Development (CPD) in Australia. She was a Governing Board member of the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) in 2010-2020 and a Board Member of Shift Project based in New York in 2014-2020. She served as a member of the Weapons of Mass Destruction Commission (WMDC) in 2004-2008, and a member of the UN Secretary General's Advisory Board on Disarmament Matters in 2008-2012.

Dewi obtained her PhD from Monash University, Melbourne in 1990, while her M.A. and B.A. (Hons) were from the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), University of London in 1982 and 1981 respectively. She is married with two children.

Ms Sharan Burrow AC

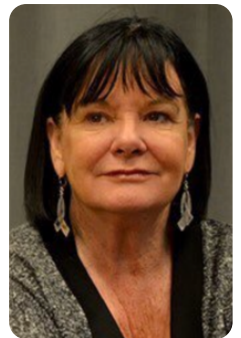
Global Advocate for Rights and Sustainability, Global Unions

Sharan Burrow is a global advocate for human and labour rights, climate action and Just Transition. She is the Former General Secretary of the International Trade Union Confederation 2010-2022. Previously she was President of the Australian Council of Trade Unions (ACTU) from 2000 – 2010.

Sharan is well known for her international advocacy on labour standards, corporate responsibility, climate action with just transition, investment in infrastructure and the green economy, investment in the care economy, women, equality and diversity, global migration and employment.

She has represented workers and civil society groups in global policy discussions in United Nations bodies, on the Governing Body of the International Labour Organisation as well as at the tables of the G7, G20, World Bank and International Monetary Fund.

Sharan is currently a board member of the European Climate foundation, a co-chair of the IEA Labour Council, a Commissioner for the Global Commission on Universal Health Coverage, deputy chair of the B Team, a member of the Commission on Global Climate Governance, a commissioner for the Global Commission on Business and Sustainable Development, an advisor to The Global Foundation and a former co-chair of the New Climate Economy. She has twice been a Co-Chair of the World Economic Forum's Annual Meeting in Davos.

He stepped down as Chief Executive at Anglo American's AGM in April 2022, and currently acts as special adviser to the new Chief Executive. He has more than 45 years of broad experience of projects, operations, marketing, business development and finance.

Mark has considerable experience in mining, having been associated with the industry since 1976 and has a practical working knowledge of most of the commodities produced and sold across the globe. He has had line experience and responsibility for mining and industrial businesses across six continents. Prior to joining Anglo American, he held the position of Chief Executive Officer at AngloGold Ashanti based in South Africa, and before that he was the Chief Operating Officer for Inco and then Vale's global Nickel business, based in Canada. Prior to his Vale role he held senior executive positions with the Normandy Group, Sons of Gwalia, Western Mining Corporation, Kalgoorlie Consolidated Gold Mines and CRA [Rio Tinto].

Mark was until recently also the Chairman of De Beers Group of Companies and a non-Executive Director of Anglo American Platinum Limited. Mark continues as a non-executive director of Total SA. Mark is a mining engineer by training with several published papers and presentations.

In May 2022, Mark became the inaugural Chairman of the Global Advisory Council of the Global Foundation.

Mr Steve Howard

Secretary General, the Global Foundation

As founding Secretary General of the non-profit Global Foundation since 1998, Steve Howard has led the necessary global push for the adoption of 'co-operative globalisation', a holistic and long-term strategy to enable a sustainable global common good.

Much of Steve's work with the Global Foundation has involved aligning leaders from the private sector, civil society, academia, faiths and institutions, and sometimes from governments, from across the world, in defining and striving for a shared global vision, backed up by concrete actions.

Many world leaders, including Pope Francis and his most senior officials at the Vatican, have personally participated in and endorsed this and related initiatives. Through this collaborative and low-key approach, Steve and the Global Foundation have helped to shape global affairs with practical outcomes.

Prior to the Global Foundation, he led the successful renaissance strategy for Melbourne, Australia in the early 1990's, including a national strategy to enable private sector investment in public infrastructure, which has since been adopted as investment model, worldwide.



Mr Shri Amitabh Kant

G20 Sherpa, India

Amitabh Kant is presently India's G20 Sherpa. The G20 or the Group of Twenty is a forum where policymakers of industrialized and developing economies meet to discuss key issues in the global economy. The G20 countries account for 85% of global GDP, 75% of world trade and about two-thirds of the world's population.

Amitabh Kant is a governance reformer and a public policy change agent for India, having driven key reforms and initiatives during his tenure as the Chief Executive Officer of the National Institution for Transforming India (NITI Aayog) (2016-2022) and the Secretary of the Department for Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP) (2014-2016), Government of India. He has been a key driver of flagship national initiatives such as Startup India, Make in India, Incredible India, Kerala: God's Own Country and the Aspirational Districts Program. These initiatives have repositioned India and Kerala and have widely been recognized as transformational.

The National Institution for Transforming India (NITI Aayog) is India's apex policy-making institution, with the Prime Minister as its Chairman. As CEO of NITI Aayog, Kant has driven a vast range of national-level developmental and policy initiatives which catalysed India's social and economic development and have brought about a paradigm shift in policy-making.

As Secretary, DIPP Kant has driven the Start-up India movement which has led to India emerging as the third-best ecosystem for startups globally, with over 70,000+ start ups and over 101+ Unicorns. His focus has been to facilitate Ease of Doing Business (EoDB) through predictability, consistency of policies and elimination of rules, regulations and procedures. This led to India jumping 79 positions in Ease of Doing Business Indicators. He also initiated competition and ranking amongst Indian states based on their EoDB indicators. The competition and ranking has led to a transformational impact on States.



Ms Sue Kench

Global Chief Executive, King & Wood Mallesons

Sue Kench is the Global Chief Executive and Co-Chairman China of King & Wood Mallesons, Asia's leading international law firm.

Sue took on the Global Chief Executive role in 2017 after leading the firm in Australia for four years as Chief Executive Partner, Australia. Sue was the first Australian woman to lead an international top tier law firm.

Sue works closely with the Global Chairman and the firm's International Management Committee to lead the firm's international growth strategy. Sue is based in Hong Kong and spends significant time in China and Australia.

She became a Partner of legacy Mallesons Stephen Jaques in 1996 and has held a number of Board, management and leadership positions in the firm over the past two decades.

Sue is married with three children.

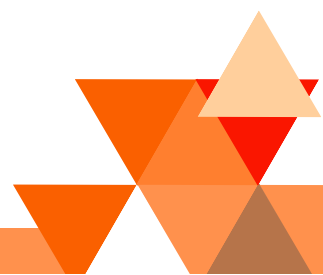
Pascal Lamy (pascallamy.eu) is the President of the Paris Peace Forum and of the European branch of the Brunswick Group. He coordinates the Jacques Delors Institutes (Paris, Berlin, Brussels).

He is also President or member of various boards with a global, european or french vocation (European Starfish Mission (ocean), Mo Ibrahim Foundation, European Climate Foundation, IFPRI, PECC, CERRE, TMEA, Antarctica 2020, Transparency International, Alpbach Forum, Beijing Forum, World Trade Forum, WEF, Global Risks, Europaeum, Collegium international, Musiciens du Louvre, Institut Mendes-France, Colbert Foundation, etc.).

He is an affiliated professor at the China Europe International Business School CEIBS (Shanghai) and at HEC (Paris).

From 2005 to 2013, Pascal Lamy served two consecutive terms as Director General of the World Trade Organization (WTO). He was previously Trade Commissioner (1999-2004), Director General of Crédit Lyonnais (1994-1999), Chief of Staff of the President of the European Commission, Jacques Delors and his G7 Sherpa (1985-1994), Deputy Chief of Staff of the French Prime Minister (1983-1985) and to the French Minister of the Economy and Finance (1981-1983).

Dr Philip Lowe

Governor, Reserve Bank of Australia

Philip Lowe is Governor of the Reserve Bank of Australia.

Mr Lowe holds a PhD from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and a B.Comm (Honours) in Economics/Econometrics from the University of New South Wales. He has authored numerous papers, including on the linkages between monetary policy and financial stability. He commenced as Governor on 18 September 2016.

He is Chair of the Reserve Bank Board and Payments System Board, and Chair of the Council of Financial Regulators. He is a member of the Financial Stability Board. Prior to his current role, he held the positions of Deputy Governor, Assistant Governor (Economic) and Assistant Governor (Financial System). He also spent two years at the Bank for International Settlements working on financial stability issues.

Mr Lowe is Chair of the Financial Markets Foundation for Children and a director of The Anika Foundation. He is also Chair of the Committee on the Global Financial System of the Bank for International Settlements.

Mr Lowe is a signatory to The Banking and Finance Oath.



Professor Riccardo Pozzo

Philosopher, Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences

Riccardo Pozzo holds the chair of the History of Philosophy of Tor Vergata University of Rome, Department of History, Humanities and Society. His research focuses on reflection and inclusion as social processes that shape our understanding of what constitutes cultural innovation, a new category of innovation economics, of which he has made the unprecedented attempt of indicating dimensions, processes and outcomes, while showing their operationalization in empirical case studies.

Graduated from the State University of Milan in 1983, he completed his education in Germany – Dr.phil. at the University of Saarland in 1988 and Habilitation at the University of Trier in 1995. In 1996 he was appointed at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. In 2003 the University of Verona called him back to the chair of the History of Philosophy. From 2009 to 2012 he directed the Institute for the European Intellectual Lexicon and History of Ideas of the National Research Council of Italy.

From 2012 to 2017, when he was head of the Department of Human and Social Sciences, Cultural Heritage of the National Research Council, he implemented Italy's participation in the European research infrastructures for social and cultural innovation CESSDA, CLARIN, DARIAH, EHRI, ERIHS, ESS, OPERAS, RESILIENCE, and SHARE. In 2022 he was elected ordinary member of the European Academy of Sciences and Arts, in 2021 ordinary member of the Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences, in 2020 corresponding member of the Accademia Roveretana degli Agiati di Scienze, Lettere ed Arti and in 2012 titular member of the Institut International de Philosophie, of which he is currently vice president; in 2014 he was awarded the Order of Merit on Ribbon of the Federal Republic of Germany.



He is currently serving on the Italian Organizing Committee of the 25th World Congress of Philosophy Rome 2024. He has published five monographs: Hegel: Introductio in Philosophiam (La Nuova Italia 1989); Kant und das Problem einer Einleitung in die Logik (Lang 1989 – trans. by Javier Sánchez-Arjona, Maia 2016); Georg Friedrich Meiers Vernunftlehre (Frommann-Holzboog 2000); Adversus Ramistas (Schwabe 2012); History of Philosophy and the Reflective Society (De Gruyter 2021).

Mr Andreas Schaal

Director for OECD Global Relations and Co-operation & OECD Sherpa, G7, G20 and APEC

Mr. Andreas Schaal is the Director for OECD Global Relations and Co-operation, as well as the OECD Sherpa to the G7, the G20 and APEC. In these functions, he supports and co-ordinates the OECD's contributions to global governance under the leadership of OECD Secretary-General Mathias Cormann. In close co-ordination with OECD Members and the OECD's External Relations Committee, he and his team implement the OECD Global Relations Strategy, engaging with over 100 partner countries around the globe at the ministerial level and building a global level playing field by increasing adherence to OECD standards and policies.

Andreas' expertise includes two decades of conceptional and strategic work on foreign affairs, national, international and global economic policy, and global governance. He is responsible for the OECD's relations with Brazil, China, India, Indonesia and South Africa as well as with Southeast Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean, South East Europe, Eurasia, and the Middle East and North Africa. The OECD Global Relations Secretariat, which he oversees and manages, includes around 100 team members. Under Andreas' leadership, it supports the Secretary-General's objectives for a regionally inclusive and globally relevant Organisation.

Between 2013-2016, he served the organisation as the Head of the Sherpa Office and the Global Governance Unit at the OECD and between 2013-2018 as the G20 Sous Sherpa. Prior to joining the OECD, Mr. Schaal held various positions during his work for the German Federal Government, including: Deputy Director G8 Summit/German Sherpa Office, Federal Ministry of Economic Affairs and Technology; Economic Counsellor, German Permanent Delegation to the OECD, Paris; Vice Chair (elected 2005-2006) of the OECD's Economic and Development Review Committee (EDRC); and Policy Advisor and Chief of Staff to Parliamentary Secretary of State Siegmur Mosdorf, MP, Federal Ministry of Economic Affairs and Technology.



Dr Huyiao (Henry) Wang

Founder & President, Center for China and Globalization

Dr. Henry Huiyao WANG is the Founder and President of Center for China and Globalization (CCG), a leading Chinese nongovernmental think tank accredited with UN "Special Consultative Status" and ranked 64th among think tanks worldwide in 2020 Global Go to Think Tank Index (GGTTI) by the University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Wang is the former Counselor to the State Council of China appointed by the Chinese premier. In addition, he serves as Vice Chairman of China Association for International Economic Cooperation under the Ministry of Commerce; Vice Chairman of China Talent Research Society under the Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security; a Director of Chinese People's Institute of Foreign Affairs and China National Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation, both organizations under the supervision of Ministry of Foreign Affairs; and Vice Chairman of China Public Relations Association. He is also Professor and Dean of the Institute of Development at Southwestern University of Finance and Economics and a member of Advisory Committee for Global Competence Development at Tsinghua University. Currently, he is a Steering Committee Member of Global Governance for the Digital Ecosystems (GGDE), the Paris Peace Forum (PPF), Pandemic Action Network (PAN) and Metropolis International; and he also sits on the Advisory Board of Duke Kunshan University and Richard Ivey Business School.

Dr. Wang was an official with the then Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation (now Ministry of Commerce) focused on China's outbound investment. Later in Canada, he was appointed by Quebec government as the Chief Trade Representative for Quebec Government Office in Hong Kong and Greater China. His senior corporate positions include Director of Asia at SNC-Lavalin and Vice President for AMEC-Agra in Canada. He also had extensive experiences in international organizations, having served as Advisory Board Member of UN's International Organization for Migration (IOM), and an advisory expert for the World Bank, the International Labor Organization (ILO) and the Alliance of Global Talent Organization (AGTO).



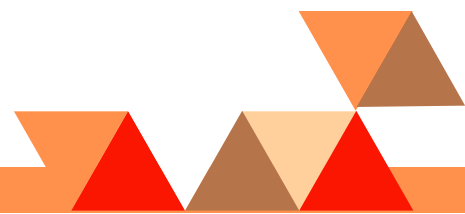
Ms Louise Watson
