



## COVID REQUIREMENTS

All China-bound travellers will need a negative COVID-19 PCR test within 48 hours before boarding. Please always bring the proof of your negative COVID-19 test result with you for inspection. You are required to declare your negative test result to China Customs by filling the Health Declaration Form on the WeChat mini-program of China Customs, or at <https://htdecl.chinaport.gov.cn>, or via the China Customs APP.

Please view your Chinese Embassy website for the most up to date covid safe requirements.

## LOCATION DETAILS

### Beijing

There are two airports in Beijing, Beijing Capital International Airport (PEK) being the primary hub for international travel in Beijing, as well as Beijing Nanyuan Airport (NAY). The latter being a military airbase handling domestic flights, and the second airport serving Beijing.

PEK is 32km away from the city centre and well connected by roads, rail, taxis, and local buses. It takes approximately 70-100 minutes to get to the city centre in Beijing depending on the location. Whereas NAY is 17 km from Beijing's city centre and it is connected to various parts of the city by taxis and Buses. It takes approximately 60 minutes to the city centre. Despite the proximity, PEK is the favourable airport when flying into Beijing.

## ACCOMMODATION

However, if you do not have a Chinese phone number it may be a bit troublesome for the driver to contact you. So, if it is possible, it is recommend setting up a Chinese phone number.



## TIMINGS

It is recommended that, if possible, you arrive in Beijing by the morning of Friday 28 April, where we will welcome delegates at a briefing in the afternoon. Attendees will remain in Beijing for the roundtable and meetings until the afternoon of Saturday 29 April, where the mission will close with a reception at the Australian Embassy.


### Meals and Dietary Requirements

### **Ms Zoon Ahmed Khan**

#### **Research Fellow, Center for China and Globalization**

Zoon Ahmed Khan is a Pakistani Researcher and Journalist based in Beijing since 2015. She is an expert on Chinese Foreign Policy including the Belt and Road Initiative, the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO), and China in the Muslim World.

She has conducted in depth fieldwork on the China Pakistan Economic Corridor, including Gwadar. Through her work she also focuses on engaging youth, business and government stakeholders to promote dialogue and cooperation in tangible ways. She has hosted and anchored various events including the World Peace Forum, CPEC Media Forum, and AGORA.

Currently she is Research Fellow at the Belt and Road Institute in Tsinghua University, Anchor for China Economic Net, Commentator on international media and think tanks including CGTN, founding Editor-in-Chief of The ShangHe Review (the first English language publication focused on the SCO Region), and is pursuing a PhD in Politics from Tsinghua University.



### **Ms Lexy Chiu**

#### **Board Director, Fuwah Group**

Lexy CHIU is currently the board director of Fuwah international Group, focusing on business development, hospitality and E-commerce.

Before Fuwah International Group, Lexy was the senior product manager and producer of Fight for the Golden Spatula, a mobile auto-chess game that was ranked No.3 in IOS app store in 2022.

Graham Fletcher has been Australia's Ambassador to China since August 2019. Prior to this appointment, Mr Fletcher was head of the North Asia Division in the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) during 2008-10 and again from 2015. During 2014, he led the team that completed negotiation of the China-Australia Free Trade Agreement.

Mr Fletcher has served in the Australian Embassy to China on three previous occasions: as Third Secretary (1986-88), Counsellor (1997-2000) and Deputy Head of Mission (2004-08). He was also Deputy Head of Mission in the Australian Embassy in Washington (2011-13) and Deputy Consul-General in the Australian Consulate-General in Noumea (1992-94).

Mr Fletcher has a Bachelor of Arts (Hons) from the University of Sydney. He joined the then Department of Foreign Affairs in 1983. He is married with three children.



**Mr Victor Gao**  
***Vice President, Center for China and Globalization***

Victor GAO is Vice President of CCG, the Chairman-Elect of the National Organization Committee of the IGU (International Gas Union)/the WGC 2024 (World Gas Conference) 2021-2024; Chairman of China Energy Security Institute; Vice Chairman of China Beidou Industrial Promotion Organization, Chairman of OBOR Group of Hong Kong, a member of the Beijing Energy Club, a Member of the Global Counsel of Asia Society in New York City, a member of the International Advisory Board of the Energy Intelligence Group in London; an advisor to Saudi Aramco and a member of the Board of Directors of several listed companies in Hong Kong.

Victor Gao has extensive experience in government, diplomacy, securities regulation, legal, investment banking, PE, corporate management, and media. Victor was Deng Xiaoping's English interpreter in the 1980s. Victor served as the China Policy Advisor at the Hong Kong Securities and Futures Commission in 1999 and 2000. Victor's prior investment banking experience included senior positions with Morgan Stanley (Vice President of Morgan Stanley Asia, in the Merger, Acquisition and Restructuring Department), CICC (General Manager of the Investment Banking Department, Head of M&A Practice, and Head of CICC Hong Kong Investment Banking Department) and Daiwa Securities (Co-Chairman of China, Executive Vice President and Managing Director). Victor's corporate management experience included senior positions with CNOOC Limited as its Senior Vice President, General Counsel, Company Secretary, Member of the Investment Committee, and Director of CNOOC International.

Victor holds a J.D. from Yale Law School, a M.A. in International Relations from the Political Science Department of Yale Graduate School, an M.A. in English from Beijing University of Foreign Studies, and a B.A. in English from Suzhou University, and is a licensed attorney-at-law in the State of New York. Victor Gao is a guest professor at the Law School of Suzhou University and is a member of the Board of Directors of Suzhou University.

Victor Gao was born in 1962 and is a PRC national based in Beijing, China.

As founding Secretary General of the non-profit Global Foundation, Steve has led the necessary global push for the adoption of 'co-operative globalisation', a positive strategy for inclusive, 'win-win' economic development and a sustainable global economy.

Many world leaders have personally participated in and endorsed this and related initiatives. Through this collaborative and low-key approach, Steve and the Global Foundation have helped to shape global affairs with practical outcomes over 20 years.

Steve led the successful renaissance strategy for Melbourne, in Australia in the 1990's, including a national strategy for private sector investment in public infrastructure, now adopted as a business model, worldwide. In 1998, he co-founded the Global Foundation, for which an early achievement was the restoration of relations between Australia and the European Union, France, in particular.

Steve is regarded in China for his contribution to China's global engagement over the past 20+ years. Highlights have included: his role in bringing China, the US and Australia together on global climate change policy; and his integral role in the establishment of the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank, the first international institution led by China. He visits China regularly for high-level dialogues embracing global co-operation and the re-making of globalisation to serve humanity.

Steve completed his Degree in Social Science at Deakin University and the Senior Executive Program at London Business School, under a British Government scholarship. He was awarded the Chevalier of the Order of Merit for his contribution to France-Australia relations in 2004.



### **Mr Shan Jiang**

#### ***Former Director-General, MOFCOM Department of American and Oceanic Affairs***

Jiang Shan, CCG Senior Fellow. Mr. Jiang joined the Chinese Ministry of Foreign Economic and Trade (later the Ministry of Commerce) in 1987, and served in the Department of American and Oceanic Affairs. He held successively the positions of Deputy Director, Director, Deputy Director-General and Director-General in the Department. He was responsible for making and implementing economic and trade development strategy and bilateral policies between China and countries in the region and handled important trade and investment issues with these countries. He was heavily involved in the making and supervision of laws and regulations, economic and trade policies regarding China's import and export, inbound and outbound investment, trade remedies as well. He helped foreign transnationals invest in China and Chinese enterprises to do M&A overseas, providing them with pertinent and penetrating advice, seeking solutions to their problems and disputes.

Mr. Jiang Shan was posted twice at the Chinese Embassy in Canada, from 1993 to 1995 (first secretary, Economic and Commercial), 2007 to 2013 (Minister Counsellor, Economic and Commercial). He recently retired from the Chinese Ministry of Commerce. He has traveled extensively and currently resides in Beijing with his wife.

## **Dr Jin Liqun**

### ***President and Chair, Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank***

Mr. Jin Liqun is the inaugural President and Chairman of the Board of Directors. On July 28, 2020, he was elected to serve a second term of five years, beginning on Jan. 16, 2021. Before being elected as the Bank's first president, Mr. Jin served as Secretary-General of the Multilateral Interim Secretariat tasked with establishing the Bank.

Mr. Jin has rich experience across the private and public sectors, as well as with MDBs. He served as Chairman of China International Capital Corporation Limited, China's first joint-venture investment bank, Chairman of the Supervisory Board of China Investment Corporation, and as Chairman of the International Forum of Sovereign Wealth Funds.

Mr. Jin previously served as Vice President, and then Ranking Vice President, of the Asian Development Bank, and as Alternate Executive Director for China at the World Bank and at the Global Environment Facility. He spent nearly two decades at the Chinese Ministry of Finance, reaching the rank of Vice Minister.

She is the Founder and Secretary General of Global Young Leaders Dialogue (GYLD) program, and also serves as Deputy Director General of the Alliance of Global Talent Organizations (AGTO), and Secretary General of China Global Talent Society. She has been one of seven representatives of young global leaders from Northeast Asia met by the King of Belgium; a Munich Young Leader 2020 posing the first question to the United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres at the MSC 2021; and Co-Chair of T20 (G20 Summit 2021 Think Tank) Multilateralism Task force.

He is National President and Chairman of the Australia China Business Council (ACBC), leading its national board in the setting of its vision and strategic plans, and oversight of its national operations.



In addition, he is former counselor to China State Council; Vice Chairman of China Association for International Economic Cooperation under the Ministry of Commerce; Vice Chairman of China Talent Research Society under the Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security; Director of Chinese People's Institute of Foreign Affairs and China National Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation, both organizations under the supervision of Ministry of Foreign Affairs; and Vice Chairman of China Public Relations Association. He is also Professor and Dean of the Institute of Development at Southwestern University of Finance and Economics and a member of Advisory Committee for Global Competence Development at Tsinghua University. Currently, he is a Steering Committee Member of the Paris Peace Forum and Metropolis International and also sits on the Advisory Board of Duke Kunshan University and Richard Ivey Business School.

Dr. Wang was once in charge of Chinese companies going global at the then Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation, and then worked as Chief Trade Representative for the Quebec Government Office in Hong Kong and Greater China, Managing Director of Asia at SNC-Lavalin, and Vice President at AMEC-AGRA in Canada; He also had extensive experiences in international organizations, having served as Advisory Board Member of UN's International Organization for Migration (IOM), and an advisory expert for the World Bank, the International Labor Organization (ILO) and the Alliance of Global Talent Organization (AGTO).

Dr. Wang pursued his PhD studies in global management at University of Western Ontario and University of Manchester. He was a Senior fellow at Harvard Kennedy School, a Visiting Fellow at the Brookings Institution and a Senior Fellow at the Asia-Pacific Foundation of Canada.
