Session Overview

In February over each of the past 4 years, the Global Foundation has convened a 'State of the World' Roundtable to better inform and engage its supporters, bringing together significant global figures to discuss some of the most substantial issues facing the world and collaborate on shaping pathways to more sustainable outcomes.

The Foundation specialises in drawing upon the talent, influence, and goodwill from all sections of global society. The roundtable will build awareness and alignment of various programs, projects, and initiatives of those taking part and will help to identify and elevate common threads of action that the Foundation itself and its allies might undertake.

Part Two of the 'State of the World' roundtable will serve in part as the launch of the Global Foundation's agenda on 'Shaping agreement on global governance, climate and nature,' through collaboration with diverse global stakeholders.

The challenge is to foster meaningful reform to the systems of global governance, for a truly sustainable environment for humanity and planet. Through concerted action and mobilisation across society, the intention of the Global Foundation is to make international cooperation more possible and fit for purpose in the modern era. Transformative thinking and investments to ensure long-term outcomes, at scale, will be at the heart of this.

The participation of Ms Amina J. Mohammed, Deputy Secretary-General of the United Nations, alongside other distinguished speakers, will help to illuminate where attention ought to be focussed over the year ahead.

Speaker Bios

Ms Amina J. Mohammed

Deputy Secretary-General, United Nations

Ms. Amina J. Mohammed is the Deputy Secretary-General of the United Nations and Chair of the United Nations Sustainable Development Group.

Prior to her appointment, Ms. Mohammed served as Minister of Environment of the Federal Republic of Nigeria where she steered the country's efforts on climate action and efforts to protect the natural environment.

Ms. Mohammed first joined the United Nations in 2012 as Special Adviser to former Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon with the responsibility for post-2015 development planning. She led the process that resulted in global agreement around the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the creation of the Sustainable Development Goals.

Ms. Mohammed began her career working on the design of schools and clinics in Nigeria. She served as an advocate focused on increasing access to education and other social services, before moving into the public sector, where she rose to the position of adviser to four successive Presidents on poverty, public sector reform, and sustainable development.

Ms. Mohammed has been conferred several honorary doctorates and has served as an adjunct professor, lecturing on international development. The recipient of various global awards, Ms. Mohammed has served on numerous international advisory boards and panels. She is the mother of six children and has two grandchildren.



Ms Sharan Burrow AC

Deputy Chair of the Global Advisory Council, Chair of the Steering Committee on Global Governance, Climate and Nature, the Global Foundation; Global advocate for Rights and Sustainability

Sharan Burrow is a global advocate for human and labour rights, climate action and Just Transition. She is the Former General Secretary of the International Trade Union Confederation 2010-2022. Previously she was President of the Australian Council of Trade Unions (ACTU) from 2000 – 2010.

Sharan is well known for her international advocacy on labour standards, corporate responsibility, climate action with just transition, investment in infrastructure and the green economy, investment in the care economy, women, equality and diversity, global migration and employment.

She has represented workers and civil society groups in global policy discussions in United Nations bodies, on the Governing Body of the International Labour Organisation as well as at the tables of the G7, G20, World Bank and International Monetary Fund.





Sharan is currently a board member of the European Climate foundation, a co-chair of the IEA Labour Council, a Commissioner for the Global Commission on Universal Health Coverage, deputy chair of the B Team, a member of the Commission on Global Climate Governance, a commissioner for the Global Commission on Business and Sustainable Development, an advisor to The Global Foundation and a former co-chair of the New Climate Economy. She has twice been a Co-Chair of the World Economic Forum's Annual Meeting in Davos.

Dr Mark Cutifani CBE

Mark Cutifani, FREng CEng FIMMM FAusIMM DBA (Hon) DoL (Hon) BE (Mining-Hons), was appointed Chief Executive of Anglo American Plc on 3 April 2013. He stepped down as Chief Executive at Anglo American's AGM in April 2022, and currently acts as special adviser to the new Chief Executive. He has more than 45 years of broad experience of projects, operations, marketing, business development and finance.

Mark has considerable experience in mining, having been associated with the industry since 1976 and has a practical working knowledge of most of the commodities produced and sold across the globe. He has had line experience and responsibility for mining and industrial businesses across six continents. Prior to joining Anglo American, he held the position of Chief Executive Officer at AngloGold Ashanti based in South Africa, and before that he was the Chief Operating Officer for Inco and then Vale's global Nickel business, based in Canada. Prior to his Vale role he held senior executive positions with the Normandy Group, Sons of Gwalia, Western Mining Corporation, Kalgoorlie Consolidated Gold Mines and CRA [Rio Tinto].



In May 2022, Mark became the inaugural Chairman of the Global Advisory Council of the Global Foundation.



Former Italian Minister, Sustainable Infrastructures and Mobility

Enrico Giovannini is full professor of Economic statistics and Sustainable development at the University of Rome "Tor Vergata" and professor and the National School of Administration (SNA). He was Minister of Sustainable Infrastructures and Mobility in the Draghi government (February 2021-October 2022) and Minister of Labour and Social Policies in the Letta government (April 2013 - February 2014).










He is co-founder and Scientific Director of the Italian Alliance for Sustainable Development (ASviS), a coalition of more than 300 organisations established to implement in Italy the UN 2030 Agenda. He was Director of Statistics and Chief Statistician of the OECD (2001-2009) and President of the Italian Statistical Institute (2009-2013).

In October 2014, the President of the Italian Republic made him "Cavaliere di Gran Croce al Merito della Repubblica", the highest ranking honour of the Italian Republic and in January 2023 he received a honorary PhD in "Sustainable development and climate change". He is the author of more than 130 articles published on national and international journals and six books on statistical and economic topics.

Tim Gould was appointed the Agency's Chief Energy Economist in 2021. As Chief Energy Economist, he provides strategic advice on energy economics across a wide range of IEA activities and analysis. Mr Gould is also Head of the Division for Energy Supply and Investment Outlooks, in which capacity he co-leads the World Energy Outlook, the IEA's flagship publication, and oversees the Agency's work on investment and finance, including the World Energy Investment report.

Svetlana Klimenko is a Global Lead for Sustainable Finance and Lead Climate Finance Specialist, Latin America and the Caribbean Region, World Bank. She has provided significant contributions to the global climate, nature, sustainable finance, and private capital mobilisation agendas, including through the engagement with the G20 Sustainable Finance Working Group, COP teams, global standard-setters, investors, United Nations, OECD and their international organizations. She coordinates WB dialogue with the Global Investors for Sustainable Development Alliance and is working on the cutting edge of sustainable finance agenda at the global, regional, and country level.







Mr Pascal Lamy

Coordinator, Jacques Delors Think Tanks

Pascal Lamy is the Vice-President of the Paris Peace Forum and of the European branch of the Brunswick Group. He coordinates the Jacques Delors Institutes (Paris, Berlin, Brussels). He is also President or member of various boards with a global, European or French vocation (European Starfish Mission (ocean), Mo Ibrahim Foundation, European Climate Foundation, IFPRI, PECC, CERRE, TMEA, Antarctica 2020, Transparency International, Alpbach Forum, Beijing Forum, World Trade Forum, WEF, Global Risks, Europaeum, Collegium international, Musiciens du Louvre, Institut Mendes-France, Colbert Foundation, etc.).

He is an affiliated professor at the China Europe International Business School CEIBS (Shanghai) and at HEC (Paris).

From 2005 to 2013, Pascal Lamy served two consecutive terms as Director General of the World Trade Organization (WTO). He was previously Trade Commissioner (1999-2004), Director General of Crédit Lyonnais (1994-1999), Chief of Staff of the President of the European Commission, Jacques Delors and his G7 Sherpa (1985-1994), Deputy Chief of Staff of the French Prime Minister (1983-1985) and to the French Minister of the Economy and Finance (1981-1983).



Dr Mabel Miao

Co-Founder and Secretary General, Centre for China and Globalization

Dr. Mabel Lu Miao is the Co-founder and Secretary-General of the Center for China and Globalization (CCG), a leading Chinese non-government think tank ranking in 64th place globally in the authoritative 2020 Global Go To Think Tank Index (GGTTI) released by the University of Pennsylvania and the only think tank in China granted "Special Consultative Status" at the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC); Over the years under the leadership of Dr. Miao, CCG has gained wide international recognition and grown into a significant think tank with global impact that promotes China's globalisation process. CCG is the only non-governmental think tank with the qualification for independent establishment of post-doctoral research workstations issued by government.

Dr. Miao also serves as Founder and Secretary General of Global Young Leaders Dialogue (GYLD) program, Deputy Director General of the Alliance of Global Talent Organizations (AGTO), Secretary General of China Global Talent Society, Secretary General of Policy Advisory Committee of Western Returned Scholars Association (WRSA) and Deputy Director-General of the International Writing Center of Beijing Normal University.

Dr. Miao holds a Ph.D degree in Modern and Contemporary Chinese Studies from Beijing Normal University. She was also a visiting fellow at New York University and Harvard University, a post-doctoral fellow of the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology (HKUS), and a Lien Fellow at Nanyang Technological University (NTU), Singapore.





Dr Steve Waygood

Chief Responsible Investment Officer, Aviva Investors

Steve Waygood has always been fascinated by the power of money to change the world. He has worked for Aviva Investors for the last 15 years where he founded its Global Responsible Investment team as well as its Sustainable Finance Centre for Excellence, which seeks to transform capital markets so that they become more sustainable. He also co-founded the Corporate Human Rights Benchmark, the World Benchmarking Alliance, and the UN Sustainable Stock Exchange Initiative.

Steve started his career at WWF-UK in 1995, where he worked on its own ethical and environmental investment policy. He has subsequently advised the UK Government, the European Commission, the Financial Stability Board and the UN on the creation of sustainable capital markets.

Steve was appointed to the European Commission High-Level Expert Group on Sustainable Finance, and the UK Green Finance Taskforce, and is also a member of the Financial Stability Board Taskforce on Climate Related Financial Disclosure (TCFD). He was highlighted by the Financial Times in 2018 as being one of the warriors of climate change among Money Managers.

His work became a case study in the Harvard Business School MBA in 2012. Steve has received the Leadership in Sustainability award from the Corporation of London and the British Chamber of Commerce. He has received awards from Brummell, the International Chamber of Commerce, the City of London, the United Nations Foundation, Yale and Harvard.





Principles and Ways of Working

Global Foundation Methodology: We aim to structure these to achieve a balance between input from speakers and contributions from participants. The program is designed to maximise the enormous breadth of experience and knowledge of the participants and facilitate, through expert moderation, the broad exchange of ideas.

Other speakers will precede and follow you. We intend to have one final session of at least 20 minutes, during which you will have the opportunity to make further brief remarks based upon what you have heard from others throughout the session, or to answer a further question.
